

St Anne's is "a genuinely mixed East End church with a passion for straightforward Bible teaching." Pre-Covid 19 we had grown to around 120 usual Sunday attendance, with a remarkably broad mix of ages, social and ethnic backgrounds, and levels of spiritual maturity. We are eager to grow further in number, in depth of maturity, and in diversity.

We seek godly, enthusiastic trainees with some potential for long-term Bible teaching ministry to join our existing small staff team. Whilst we welcome applications from all, we would like the staff team to be increasingly reflective of the diversity of the area and the church family.

Your time will be divided between three areas:

### 1. Pastoral/Bible teaching

You will develop specific areas of Bible-teaching and pastoral responsibility in line with our Mission Action Plan priorities.

This may include some (not all) of the following:

- Younger children and schools work;
- Pre-teens and teens;
- Younger adults;
- Ministry among the marginalised, e.g. through our homeless night shelter;
- Outreach among people from Muslim backgrounds;
- Service leading and preaching.

### 2. Formal training

You will spend approx. one day a week engaged in formal training, likely on the Cornhill Training Course. The training provision will be discussed with the successful candidate.

### 3. Practical tasks

You will have regular and ad hoc practical responsibilities, depending on aptitude and the needs of the church. This may include physical tasks in the building; administration; technical support; or other tasks as agreed.

## Terms

- In common with similar roles elsewhere, the church may contribute to accommodation costs and pay your training fees and a training bursary, but you will need to raise the remainder of your support yourself. This will be discussed with the successful candidate.
- Working days will normally be Sunday to Friday, although Saturday working will occasionally be required.
- You will report to the Rector, Richard Bray, or Kate McNab, parish worker.
- The initial commitment will be for one year, with the hope that this might be extended up to a total of three years.
